

VD 119 TH Old and New Testament - 13.05.2018

Dear viewers and readers,

Today I'd like to talk to you about the topic Old and New Testament.

In the last few years voices of theologians were being raised, saying that one can detach oneself from the Old Testament, that it is unnecessary for Christians, redundant and therefore negligible concerning the content.

Throughout the last 20 years, I have had and continue to encounter the Blessed Mother, Jesus and God the Father in my role as a mystic. Several times I have been made aware of the Bible and the importance of its content in the context of these contacts.

God therefore points me to different passages in the Bible - both in the Old and the New Testament - and thus emphasizes their significance. In this way He himself certifies those texts which we call for a reason „word of God“.

On May 12, 2012, Jesus said to me, *"The Scripture will be fulfilled!"* and cited quasi himself, repeating the words in Luke chapter 20, vers 37. He didn't mean a concrete section, but the Holy Scripture in its entirety.

Let us also remember Lk chapter 24, verses 25-27, when Jesus was on the way to Emmaus with two disciples. There we read:

25 And he said to them, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! 26 Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" 27 And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself.

The Lord is the best scholar and connoisseur of the Bible. Many contents in the Old Testament indicate His coming. The fulfillment of the Scripture confirms the truth contained in the words of the prophets.

If we reject the Old Testament or question it, we not only act foolishly as one who bites the hand that feeds him, but also dishonor the recordings that are expressly declared as the "holy" script.

Jesus himself used the *Tanakh* on many occasions for his sermons and used quotes from it. Through this concrete action he also invalidates the arguments of those who today believe that the Old Testament refers exclusively to the Jewish religion and therefore became obsolete with the beginning of the use of the New Testament for Christians.

As a mystic, I am always allowed to experience the All-Kind as a loving Father, who effortlessly moves away over the millennia into the present. He is the God who has already spoken to Abraham and Moses. The eternal God is timeless (that's why we call him that) and doesn't look dusty or outdated on me. God is always "up to date" and not a senile old man, who has no idea of the reality of our modern life. Therefore, let's not make the mistake of questioning his divine omnipotence.
